### **FULL SYNOPSIS**

Based on the actual events of a 1994 bombing in Buenos Aires, **GOD'S SLAVE** follows Ahmed, trained since childhood as an Islamic terrorist now assigned to execute a suicide bomb at a synagogue, and David, the cold-blooded Israeli special agent who will stop at nothing to prevent the attack. But neither man is defined solely by their extremist views. Ahmed, posing as a doctor, lives happily with his wife and young son; though David's marriage is on the rocks, he remains devoted to his wife and daughter. With time running out before the attack, David zeroes in on Ahmed as a suspect, his investigation culminating in violent, if unexpected, consequences.

### **EXCERPT FROM AN INTERVIEW WITH DIRECTOR JOEL NOVOA**

### What made you want to tell this story as a feature film?

I have always been intrigued by fundamentalism. That intrigue grew after I was supposed to fly from Venezuela to the United States to catch a plane in New York on September 11, 2001. I was unable to take that plane since I got dengue fever while shooting a movie in the Venezuelan jungle. I watched news of the attack in my jungle hospital TV, and little by little started researching the lives of the terrorists responsible for the attack, mainly getting a big interest in their cover lives.

I got specifically attracted to the AMIA attack years later, when I was in Argentina mixing the sound of another terrorist themed short film called *Zona Cero*, and there was a commemoration of the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the attack. As I started reading, I started feeling sympathy for the victims, who after 15 years had not received an answer for their tragedies. This impunity drew me to investigate the attack more, and the more I investigated, the more confusing the story sounded.

Finally, I realized there were more than five countries involved in the tragedy and decided to make a story that could raise the topic of this tragedy again 20 years later, but at the same time make it interesting, entertaining, and a point of tolerance by mixing different countries into this story.

### **CREW BIOGRAPHIES**

### **JOEL NOVOA, Director**

Joel holds an M.F.A in Film Directing from American Film Institute, and graduated from Metropolitan University in Caracas, Venezuela with a Law Degree. He also studied one year in UCLA's Extension Film Production program. Working in films since the age of 6, Joel has also directed eight short films with selections and honors in more than 30 film festivals, including Cannes, L.A.LIFF, La Habana, TNT Project 48, and the Kuala Lumpur International Film Festival. Joel's thesis film from A.F.I *Machsom* was awarded the prestigious Caucus Foundation Grant, and the Deluxe Laboratories Grant. As first Assistant Director, he has worked on four award-winning features, with official selections and awards in Tokyo, Shanghai, and the Spanish Academy Awards (Goya), and an official submission from Venezuela to Academy Awards.

God's Slave is Joel's first feature as a director, at the age of 26, shot in four different countries, after winning contests and co-production grants in Argentina, Spain, Venezuela and Uruguay.
